George the Second by: To all by: Know ye that for divers Good Causes
 and Considerations but more especially for and in Consideration of the Sum of
 Thirty five Shillings of Good and lawful Money for our New paid to our
 Remains General of our Revenue in this our Colony and Dominion of Virginia
 We have given granted and Confirmed and by these presents for us our Heirs
 and Successors To give grant and Confirm unto Charles Drape one certain Tract
 or Parcel of Land containing four hundred and seventy five Acres lying and being
 in the County of Southampton on the South Side of Nettoway River, and on the
 South Side of the Three Creeks, and bounded as followeth (to wit) Beginning
 at two white Oaks and a Birch by the Side of the aforesaid Three Creeks Thence South
 twenty one Degree East ninety four Poles to a gum a Corner of his other Land thence
 by his own old Lines South twenty one Degree East one hundred & twenty Poles to a
 Red Oak South five Degree West twenty eight Poles to a Red Oak South thirty eight
 Degree West fifty four Poles to a Spruce and South sixty two Degree West fifty
 two Poles to a Stake a Corner of John Sharp's Land, then by the said Sharp's
 Line South fifty five Degree East two hundred and thirty Poles to a Spruce, then
 South fifteen Degree West eighty eight Poles to a Spruce at the head of the Green Ford
 Branch then down the said Branch to three Trees chept inwards a Corner of
 James Drape's Land thence by the said Drape's Lines North fifty five Degree West
 two hundred & forty six Poles to a Hickory North ten Degree West one hundred
 Poles to a Spruce by the Side of a small Branch and down the various Courses
 of the said Branch to a Maple then North twenty five Degree West fifty two
 Poles to a Gum by the Side of the Three Creeks aforesaid and down the various
 Courses of the Run of the said Creek to the Beginning. One hundred and thirty
 five Acres part thereof being formerly granted unto the said Charles Drape by
 Letters Patent Dated the twenty fourth Day of March one thousand seven
 hundred & twenty five of three hundred and forty Acres the Remainder never before granted
